World Communion Sunday

The first Sunday of October is a time when Christians in every culture break bread and pour the cup to remember and affirm Christ as the Head of the Church.

It offers congregations a distinctive opportunity to experience

Holy Communion in the context of the global community of faith.





Dr. Donald Craig Kerr, first conceived the notion of World Communion Sunday during his year as moderator of the General Assembly (1930). It was an attempt to bring churches together in a service of Christian unity—in which everyone might receive both inspiration and information, and above all, to know how important the Church of Jesus Christ is, and how each congregation is interconnected one with another. Bread has a significance beyond mere nutrition in many cultures in the Western world and Greater Middle East because of its history and contemporary importance. It is also significant in Christianity as one of the elements of the Eucharist.


